ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES

Major economic activities include:

- Industries of primary and secondary level,
- Subsistence and commercial farming,
- Small scale enterprises and

- Commercial retail as well as wholesale.

The average of 35% population of Morogoro Municipal Council are involve in business, 33% are involved in Agriculture, 16% are employed in different institutions, 5% are involved in industrials activities and 11% are involved are involved in pety trade.

The 2009 Economic Survey Report shows that Morogoro region’s share of the national GDP was 5.1 percent equivalent to TShs.1,137,317 million and ranked number 6. While Per capita income of regional residents was estimated at TShs.665,618 which was less than that of Tanzania Mainland.

AGRICULTURE

Agriculture Sector employed 33 percent of the municipals’ total population and it is very common in sub urban areas. Horticulture crops like vegetables, tomatoes, sweet pepper and onions are the common crops. Staple food, maize and paddy are also planted in some areas of the municipal though in small scale.

LIVESTOCK

Morogoro municipal had the lowest percent of households involved in livestock keeping Urban nature of the municipal made livestock keeping not much of an economic activity. Also, shortage of grazing land and by laws introduced by municipals in the country which prevent massive livestock keeping are among the reasons for the municipal to have the lowest percent of households involved in livestock keeping in the region.However, cattle, goat, sheep, pigs and poultry are some of the livestock kept under zero grazing in the municipal.

About 8.2% of the population is engaged in livestock farming. According to the data available, only few people [households] keep livestock and many of them practice indoor livestock keeping or zero grazing. In recent years, the number of livestock, especially dairy cattle, has increased. However, free grazing is the most serious problem for cattle keepers. Below is table showing livestock population;-

Morogoro municipal has a total of 329 industries, That is large industries are 15, medium industries are 10 and small industries are 313.

E. Population size and demographic composition:

E. Population Size

According to Population and Housing Census of 2012, the population of the Municipality was 315,866 people of which 164,166 were women and 151,700 were men, the growth rate in the Municipality was 4.7% per annum. The Current population projection of Morogoro Municipality is 359,677 whereby 187,572 are women and 171,105 are men. The average income of a person is Tshs. 539,375.00 per year.

Geographical setting:

Morogoro Municipality has a total land area of 531sq.kms with 24.7 Sq. kms water area, equivalent to 0.4 percent of the total regional land area. Currently, it is divided into one division with 29 wards subdivided into 295 Mitaa. Politically, the district has one constituency, namely Morogoro Town. The major physical features include the famous Uluguru Mountains, which lie in the southeastern part, and Mindu mountains, which lie in the western part.

There are three main rivers with several tributaries, which form a number of alluvial flood plains. These rivers are the Morogoro, Kilakala, and Bigwa. Other sources of water are the Mindu Dam which was built in the late 1980s to serve for the industrial activities as well as domestic purposes.

Location:

Morogoro Municipality is about 195 kilometers to the west of Dar es Salaam and is situated on the lower slopes of Uluguru Mountains whose peak is about 1,600 feet above sea level. Morogoro Municipality is one of the Nine Councils in Morogoro Region. Other Councils include Kilosa, Kilombero, Mvomero, Ulanga, Gairo, Malinyi, Ifakara Town and Morogoro Rural. The Morogoro Municipal Council borders Mvomero District on the North and West; and Morogoro Rural District on the East and the South. It lies at the crossings of longitudes 37.0 east of the Greenwich Meridian and latitude 4.49 south of Equator.

Climate

The highest temperature occurs in November and December, with an average of 33°C while the minimum temperature occurs in June and August with the average temperatures of 16°C. The mean relative humidity ranges between 66% - 37% and the total average annual rainfall

ranges between 821 mm to 1,505 mm. Long rains occur between March and May and short rains occur between October and December each year.

Transport and Communication network.

The Municipality has a large internal network of all weather roads making easy movement of people and goods. The road network makes it easy to conduct business activities.
