

In Guatemala, a Central American country, there is still a patriarchal and "machista" culture that excludes women and other marginalized groups from society. This fuels the gender gaps reflected in women's participation in the economy, their political leadership, and their access to goods and services.

Only 37% of women participate in the formal labour market (as compared to 85% of men)

In the Colombian society, it is difficult for women to occupy high-level political participation positions – especially indigenous and rural women, who face greater inequalities. A major factor affecting women's lives and opportunities in Colombia has been the civil armed conflict of recent decades.

Most of the victims of forced displacement during the internal conflict were women and children.

In Sweden, gender equality has become an important part of the Swedish identity, as evidenced by the fact that it is the number 5 country in the ranking of the most gender-equal countries in the world. However, there are still challenges related to gender-based violence, equal pay for equal jobs, among others.

Women are 41 % more likely to experience stress-induced mental health issues

Guatemala, Colombia and Sweden have achieved important victories in recent decades in promoting gender equality, but much remains to be done. Local governments can be champions for gender equality and that is why we decided to work together!
